
GP48 Jimmy Chibbles Bishop herringbone and reverse stocking stitch columns

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The original gansey has an error in the pattern repeat. The first seven chevrons on one side and the first 12 on the other have the lower version A, where the next chevron follows on the row above the previous, while the remainder have version B, with an extra row between the chevrons. Thus, one pattern repeat is six rows high and the other seven. Incidentally there is another minor mistake in the gansey, where one of the chevron arms has an extra stitch (a seventh) but it is not shown in this chart. Neither of these detracts from the beauty of the gansey.

Knitted by Esther Nurse in a very dark navy 5-ply worsted and is unusual compared with others from Sheringham and is rather like a lighter-weight version of the "Fisherman's Iron" 5-ply worsted used in Yorkshire.
